

Training Requirements for Coaches and On Ice Volunteers including Managers and Hockey Safety Persons

Coaching and volunteering in any capacity is absolutely vital for the development of our young hockey players in the CCMHA and to grow the sport of hockey as a whole. Hockey Canada and Hockey New Brunswick have mandated training courses and requirements to ensure our young players are safe and learning the skills they need for success.

PLEASE NOTE THAT ALL QUALIFICATIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY DECEMBER 15TH, 2016

Respect in Sport- volunteer version replaces the former course Speak Out Course (classroom)
Coach 2 replaces Coach 1 (Intro to Coach) and Coach Stream

**the checking clinic is only mandatory for coaches at the peewee level. From hockey Canada's

perspective, the goal is to have peewee coaches teaching techniques to the kids in peewee so they are better prepared for body contact at the bantam level. We, however, would not preclude a bantam coach from participating in the clinic.
